**The task:** Under the leadership of Field Director Peter Thomas the field area of Africa (Central, Eastern, Southern and Western Region) has approximately 817,000 members, worshiping in 6,900 churches in 43 nations. As the church is

growing in rural and urban areas and among unreached people groups, especially in the 10/40 window; ongoing and consistent Leadership Development and Ministerial Training are key elements. The 14 active Bible Schools and various extension programs have a current enrollment of 1,499 students.



In Tourism they produced the best results nationwide. Together with an intentional impact into the spiritual life of students, the community and future of Rwanda is being shaped.
