Massai Land Kenya

Visiting Missionary Partners in Ngoswani, Narok was certainly a highlight during last year. Dr. Tanya Hawthorne and Linda Brown, both American Missionaries made us welcome into their Missions location. Dr. Tanya pioneered a Clinic/Hospital 11 years ago in the middle of nowhere. Now established as a 24h clinic with emphasis on birth deliveries. Per week, up to eight babies are being delivered and numerous other patients treated, using relevant medical equipment

like x-ray machine etc. Years

later Linda came to join and started a school and Kindergarten. In the beginning four pupils attended now 46 children are enrolled. Together they founded a Massai congregation with a beautiful church building. Peter was privileged to bring the Word of God to these precious people. It is indeed a true rural setting; solar panels provide electricity as well as a standby generator. A water well and tanks provide water. We were deeply touched by the dedication and compassion of Tanya and Linda. God has blessed the labor of their hands greatly.

BidiBidi Refugee Camp – Northern Uganda


Another highlight this year was our visit to the BidiBidi Camp together with East Africa Superintendent Joseph Kagarama. It was such a joy to meet Overseer John Noah, his wife Edina and Bro. Lolik from Juba, Southern Sudan together with about 200 pastors who gathered for a Leadership Conference in the Imvepi Camp. John and Edina have now established 67 congregations, opened a Nursery School in Morobi Camp with 250 pupils and tailoring classes for women. Still now truckloads of refugees from South Sudan are arriving daily. UN-Passports are issued with an expiry date of 2040. The UN is committed for a long-term presence.

We were much encouraged and very blessed to receive reports from countries where Church of God World Missions is represented, to learn that we operate:

- > 73 Primary Schools with 13685 pupils enrolled
- 3 Secondary Schools with 671 students
- ▶ 85 Kindergarten/Nurseries with 5957 children
- > 113 Feeding Programs with 10540 being served
- 4 Orphanages with 544 orphans
- ▶ 14 Widows assistance programs with 11685 assisted
- 2 Soccer outreach programs with 220 young people
- 26 Boreholes & water wells with numerous communities receiving clean water
- 3 Vocational Training Schools enrolled 478 students

Most of these programs are National initiatives without any support from outside. Our brothers and sisters are truly given to compassion, love and empathy.
